# Policies and practices and their impact on the book chain



### **National Book Policy**

- ✓ Basic guide for all stakeholders
- ✓ Informed policy choices
- √ Roles and responsibilities per stakeholder

Impact on book quality: basic guide for all stakeholders, ensuring efficiency of the system needed to deliver quality books in time

# Book evaluation and approval policy

- ✓ Liberalized book market or not?
- ✓ If so: gov't evaluates books on pedagogical quality and physical quality
- ✓ List of approved books

Impact on book quality: key process in setting the standards for quality and approving only those that meet the criteria

#### Language of Instruction policy

- ✓ Importance of mother tongue education and feasible implementation policy
- ✓ Implications on book chain: fragmentation of demand
- ✓ Replicate processes for each language version
- ✓ Manage increase of unit costs so benefit of mother tongue learning outweighs additional costs

Impact on book quality: the language of a book will determine the readability for the learner



### **Procurement policy**

- ✓ Centralized or decentralized
- ✓ School based choice = decentralized
- ✓ School ownership, matches demand and priorities, book relevance

Relevance for book quality: school choice and ownership of the books selected, based on their quality and relevance



### **Communication policy**

- ✓ Lack of communication causes above challenges
- ✓ Change would improve:
  - 1. Stakeholder collaboration and preparation
  - 2. Demand aggregation
  - Coordinate efforts and facilitates PPP's
  - 4. Accountability mechanism
  - 5. Accommodate user feedback

Impact on book quality: supports efficiency of the book chain and facilitates user feedback that can help improve quality continuously
